Curriculum

The curriculum here in Newport College adapts to meet the students needs and desires. We offer a diverse range of subjects to Higher Level for Junior and Senior Cycle.

Junior Cycle Curriculum

First Year students in Newport College will study all of the core subjects and option subjects during the first year. They will then choose three optional subjects to study with their

core subjects for their Junior Cycle programme. Science and History are core subjects along with English, Irish and Maths. Students are surveyed on their subject choice at the end of First Year. Every opportunity is taken to ensure student preference is met resulting in the highest possible satisfaction rating.

The eight key skills of Junior Cycle are embedded into all aspects of the Junior Cycle Curriculum.

LCVP

Leaving Certificate Vocational Programme is an additional subject, if eligible.

LCVP is an enhanced Leaving Certificate Programme designed to give a strong vocational dimension to the Leaving Certificate. The programme combines the virtues of academic study with a new and dynamic focus on self-directed learning, enterprise, work and the community. Young people taking the LCVP have a unique opportunity to develop their interpersonal, vocational and technological skills. These skills are equally relevant to the needs of those preparing for further education, seeking employment or planning to commence their own business sometime in the future.


LCA

The Leaving Certificate Applied is a two-year Leaving Certificate, available to students who wish to follow a practical or vocationally orientated programme. The Leaving Certificate Applied is made up of a range of courses that are structured round three elements: Vocational Preparation, Vocational Education and General Education.

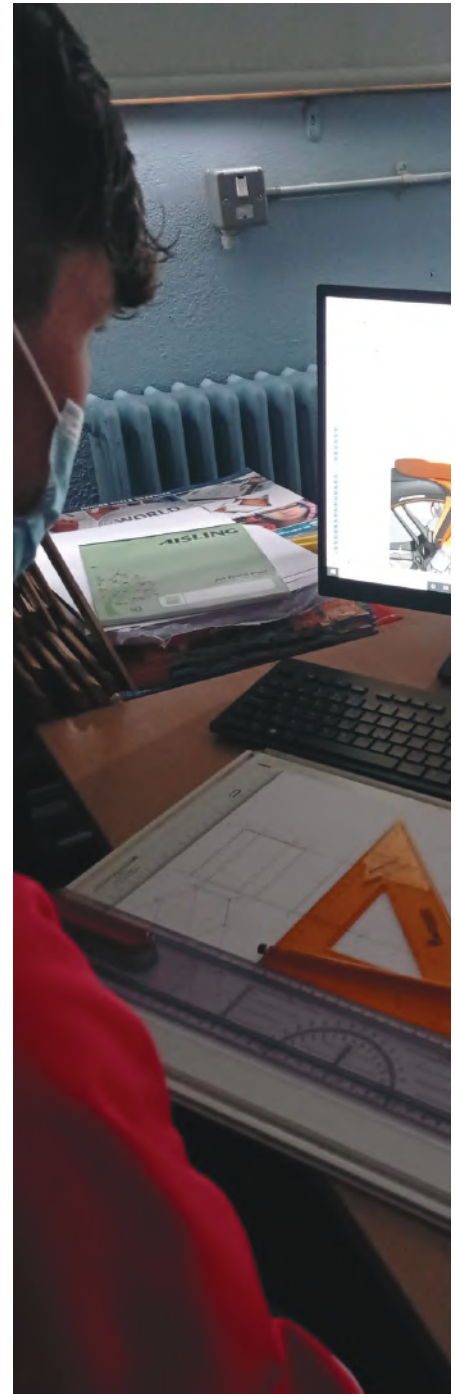
Digital Learning

Here in Newport College we recognise and appreciate the value technology plays in both teaching and learning and how it can assist students. Students develop a wide range of skills through the use of technology such as digital literacy, innovation, and collaboration.

Microsoft Office is the online learning platform used in our school to support student learning. Each student is given an ETB email account through which they engage with Outlook email, One drive and MTeams. Microsoft Teams is a learning platform

that allows teachers to share material with students, set homework, correct student assignments, and connect with students. The use of this platform ensured that all students were supported during the period of remote learning in 2020.

We recognise the importance of technology in education, and support the existing computer lab. School management has significantly invested in the provision of two sets of portable Chromebooks. These are utilised across subjects to enhance the student learning experience.



Transition Year

Transition Year is a popular option for students in Newport College. It is designed to act as a bridge between the Junior Cycle and Leaving Certificate programmes.

It is tailored to meet the needs and interests of each individual group. The aim of the programme is to: 'promote the personal, social, educational and vocational development of pupils and to prepare them for their role as autonomous, participative, and responsible members of society (DES).

Music and the Performing Arts

At Newport College music and the performing arts are an ever present and perpetually developing facet of our unique school community.

We welcome musicians of all types, interests and backgrounds. In fact, every student who attends Newport College will be immersed into the area of music education both in first year and then again during TY. Our music department have inspired many students over the years to pursue their musical interests for junior and leaving certificate.



The music department is well established. The classroom instrument is the ever popular ukulele as well as myriad of other instruments including guitars, piano and drums. The music department accommodates both left and right handed players. Music students have access to the IT room which is fully loaded with all types of music packages and software. Music technology is an integral part of the new music curriculum and Newport College are committed to ensuring that all students' needs are met in relation to all subjects that our students study. The school has music education right through to Leaving Certificate and it is growing in popularity.



Newport College holds an annual school show in which all students are

encouraged to participate in. These shows incorporate diverse talents from across the school community and will often feature solo acts, rock bands, traditional Irish music, singing, choir, drama, dance and more. This is a stage where students can perform new songs, act in plays that they have written themselves and to perform with students from other year groups that they wouldn't normally have time to do so

School graduations, Seachtain na nGaele, other ceremonies and in particular the school open night are other opportunities for our students to showcase their hard work and talent. Many hours of work will go into rehearsals for special occasions like these: any excuse to develop and grow as musicians and we'll be there.



Our music teacher Mr. Cuniffe has a great love for all things traditional Irish music and has consistently led the school's traditional group to new heights with his arrangements and new compositions. The group have performed at Newport Tradfest and

regularly at the TETB Talent showcase. The aim is to emulate groups such as Lunasa, Beoga, Danú and many more. The 'trad ensemble' meet every week at lunch time and more regularly in the lead up to any event. The ensemble is open to all students who want to be part of the ensemble, not just traditional instruments or traditional musicians. Think of it more like an orchestra, much more like a groupa ceoil you might see at a Fleadh. The Siansa Gael Linn competition will be our next adventure.

The ukulele club meet once a week. It is an inclusive and social space where students who study music in the school and students who have an interest in ukulele can meet and play. There have been other groups too over three years where students have shown an interest in drums or choir among other things. There is always something for everyone. It is so important to nourish people's musical abilities. Music is something that we can all take part in at any age and being involved in music can positively affect ones academic, physical and mental wellbeing. It's a great life skill to have and you've every opportunity to do so here at Newport College.

The school continues to promote music and music education this is further evidenced by embracing a partnership with Music Generation Tipperary who will be establishing a hub at the school in the near future.

Student Leadership

Newport College has a strong tradition of Student Leadership and promotes and encourages student involvement in a number of programmes.

Student Council: The Student Council are elected by their peers to represent their year group. Students are given an opportunity to voice their ideas and opinions and debate issues of concern to them. They meet regularly and develop long and short term targets for the academic year.

Head Boy and Head Girl:

A senior male and female student are elected by their peers to represent the group and the school. These students meet regularly with school management to discuss student issues.

The Mentoring Programme:

This is a peer mentoring programme whereby Transition Year students are paired with a First Year student. This helps students to settle into life in Newport College and make the transition easier for new students. A number of activities are organised throughout the year. Senior students gain valuable experience in leadership skills through this programme.





Pastoral Care

This is an area of great importance in Newport College as we strive to fulfill our school motto of: 'every child matters'. We endeavour to create a school community where students feel safe, valued, respected, and that they belong.

Pastoral Care in our school strives to support students in a variety of areas: the transition from primary to secondary school, secondary to tertiary education, exam pressure, relationships, personal development.

Year Head and Tutor:

Each year group has a designated Year Head and class tutor who look after and look out for each student in their group. Year Heads liaise with parents and staff to ensure that students needs are being met.

Study Skills, Supervised Study, Homework Club:

Each year, study skills workshops are organised for students.


Supervised Study runs Monday to Thursday from 4pm to 6pm for students who wish to avail of it.

Homework Club also runs on these days for junior students.

Special Educational Needs Team/ Learning Support: The SEN co-ordinator and SEN team meet regularly to develop Individual Education Plans for students, develop strategies for students and teachers to support student learning in conjunction with parents, students and staff. Team teaching is in place to support student learning.


Guidance and Counselling:

The Guidance Counsellor plays a pivotal role in our school. Our aim is to assist all students in their holistic development while providing educational, vocational and personal guidance. This is done through the implementation of the school Guidance Programme. This programme in place has been developed to suit the needs of our students as they progress
